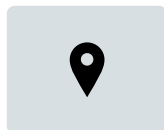

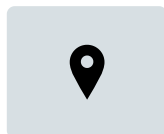

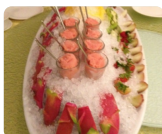

Depart Marina Bay Sands at 9:45 a.m. for the National Museum of Singapore. Take the MRT from Bayfront to Bencoolen, and walk approximately 5 minutes to the National Museum of Singapore. The total journey will be about 15 minutes. Alternatively, you may take a taxi or rideshare. The journey will be about 6 minutes. If you plan on having breakfast near the museum, we suggest departing around 8:45 a.m.

Arrive at the National Museum of Singapore around **10:00 a.m.** Learn about Singapore's three major ethnic groups, Malay, Chinese, and India, and exactly how and when each ethnic group cemented their place in Singapore's history. We highly recommend exploring the Singapore History Gallery which charts the development of the island as it was known through the years as Singapura, a Crown Colony, Syonan-To, and finally, Singapore.
